Circle of Support

Circle of Support (COS) is a program that offers mentoring and companionship for folks who are caught up in the cycle of incarceration. Because of the way our justice system is set up it is very difficult for an individual to make it out of the seemingly never ending cycle in our jail/prison systems. When a person is released from jail or prison they are sent out the same way they came in. They may or may not have a place to live, money to find housing, medications they need, or even food. Many have no choice but to rely on old friends, those whose influence is not one of being a productive member of society. The COS, made up of 5 or 6 functioning members of the community, offers support that many don't get from friends or family. Circle members are not expected to provide money or housing, just good advice. COS members often know of opportunities and options available in the community that could help folks out of the cycle. Most circles meet weekly and chat like old friends. If you are interested in forming your own circle, or joining an existing circle please contact Cheryl Peters. Monetary donations are also welcomed and encouraged.
